DOMINICA NOMINATES CANDIDATE FOR THE POST OF SECRETARY GENERAL OF IMO

The Minister for Foreign Affairs, International Business, Trade and Energy, the Honourable Dr Vince Henderson, confirmed that the Government of Dominica has nominated Dr Cleopatra Doumbia-Henry, President of the World Maritime University as a candidate for the position of Secretary-General of the International Maritime Organisation (IMO).
